1. Why do you want to be appointed to the City Council? What do you feel you will bring to the position?

I have lived in Eureka since 1985 and Humboldt County all of my life. I believe in giving back to the community and serving as a City Council member would be a great opportunity to do that. I formerly served on the Eureka Parking Place Commission as Chair and on the Eureka Housing Advisory Board as Vice Chair. I currently serve on the Eureka Planning Commission as Vice Chair. I feel I have a strong grasp of the issues facing our city. I know a lot of people here so I have the ability to tap into information and locate volunteers to help where needed. Eureka needs leadership that will bring long range benefits to our city. I will bring to this position a direct, professional, and focused style with lots of energy so that we can deal with the complex issues facing Eureka.

2. Look ten years into the future and describe what you want this city to look like and why?

Eureka is the business, retail and industrial hub of the county. It is the center of government services and an attractive tourist destination. We also have many wonderful and attractive residential areas. It's important that it remains that way. My time on the council will be devoted to make sure that happens. We need to make sure that business is welcome here but not to the detriment of residential life or our environment. We need to ensure we have nature and services that attract visitors but not at the expense of needed growth. We must develop our harbor and waterfront. All of our government agencies must work together, not in conflict to get this done.

3. What do you see as the biggest challenges facing this city today?

There are several challenges:

-Hiring a new city manager.

-Making sure we have adequate revenue to provide needed services and that these revenues are used wisely in high impact areas. We need more money to attract, train & retain high quality people for our Police Force, Fire Department and Public Works. We also need to provide them with better technology, tools, equipment, wages and benefits.

-We need to be more effective in combating crime, the homeless population, illegal drug use and other areas for people with special needs. I have been working in this area for many years with my rental properties and at our Church with Celebrate Recovery.

-We also need to attract, retain and expand our business base that provides the jobs and revenues needed to maintain our quality of life. Including finding other sources of income such as grants.

4. What do you feel needs to be done to maintain and enhance the City's economic health?

There are several things that could be done to improve our local economy. We need to do a better job of improving harbor trade and completing our waterfront projects. Next, we need to stay up to date on high speed internet & wireless communications. We need to make sure our roads, waste water treatment and infrastructure are maintained. We need to develop a world class system of multi model transportation options including an integrated system of trails.

5. What would be your three top priorities for improving our community's quality of life?

First, I would like to encourage Old Town area development on the Boardwalk, Waterfront and the Balloon Tract to make this the retail, business and residential center it has the potential to become. Second, to work in closer cooperation with the Harbor District to improve the viability of the Port. We need to partnership with other cities to make effective use of our Foreign-Trade Zone efforts. Finally we need to do something about the homeless issue. We really need to tackle this problem.
