






### **ADVANTEGES**

- Letters of support


















## **ADVANTEGES**

#### Permit Criteria

- Encroachment permit
- Liability insurance
- Indemnity to City (hold harmless agreement)
- Building permit (under certain criteria)
- Design drawings
- Maintenance Plan

### Design Criteria

- Dimensions and buffers (vehicular safety)
- Access and enclosure (pedestrian safety)
- Stability and security
- ADA and accessibility
- Materials
- Drainage
- Designed for easy removal/restoration
- Be attractive and creative




Figure 1. Parking Spaces




Figure 2. Corner Locations and Driveways







Figure 3. Street Slope




Parklets may not be constructed over utility access panels or stormdrains.



























# Eureka Parklet Pilot Program

Autumn	Winter	Spring	Summer	Autumn	Winter

- During that time, staff will evaluate:
  - Suitability of design standards
  - Stormwater impacts
  - Traffic impacts
  - Parking impacts
  - Neighborhood sentiment
  - Increase in business
  - Other considerations

- Provide opportunities for the following to provide feedback:
  - Planning Commission
  - Economic Development Commission
  - Design Review Committee
  - Traffic Safety Commission
  - Open Space and Parks Committee
  - Arts and Culture Commission

# What happens after the Pilot?

- Pilot unsuccessful terminate EPs of pilot parklets
- Pilot successful staff presents options to Council (month 12 to 16)
  - Final design guidelines and regulations
  - Density restrictions
  - Municipal Code changes
  - Etc



### Staff Recommendations

- Alter pilot program to allow four parklets for the 18-month pilot period.
- Authorize staff to begin encroachment permit process with the following businesses in order to allow each business to build a parklet in City of Eureka right-of-way: "A Taste of Bim," "Ramones," "Taste at Humboldt Bay Tourism Center," and "Siren Song."
